The Mid Week Make Up Training is designed to give athletes more time on snow, and to make mid week training more manageable for parents. If you require, your child may stay at the Graduates Club Lodge for five nights for a cost of \$160. This included lodging and three meals per day. Supervision will also be provided by coaches or parents.

The first camp at Whakapapa is open to all ski racing athletes based out of Turoa or Whakapapa. The second camp at Turoa is open to all athletes, from both sides.

The registration deadline is 17 July 2010 for all camps. At that time full payment of lodging is required. Please give this form to your coach or post this form to Ruapehu Sport, Ruapehu Alpine Lifts, Private Bag 71902, Mt Ruapehu 3951. There are no refunds in these programmes.

By enrolling my/our child in a Ruapehu Sport Programme I/We understand that commitment and attendance is required and that a code of conduct is expected of my child and of his/her parents. Ruapehu Sport and Ruapehu Alpine Lifts Ltd. may refuse or withdraw participation from the programmes with no refund for behavior or misconduct of athletes or parents that contravenes the code of conduct and partner agreement. Further to the code of conduct our travel policy applies to those being supervised in the lodging option. Please see below.

Travel Policy

Supervision – Applies to all athletes

- 1) Athletes to be at accommodation location no later than sunset, unless approved and supervised by the designated adult
- 2) Athletes to be supervised by the designated adult no later than 8pm

Athlete conduct – Applies to all athletes

- 3) Entry into any (bed) room other than the one designated to the athlete is strictly forbidden
- 4) Abide by the schedule that is provided daily at team meetings
- 5) Follow instructions given by supervisors

Supervisor conduct – Applies to designated adults whether it is a coach or parent

- 6) Be on site and stay on site to supervise athletes at designated time
- 7) Ideally one supervisor per gender will be designated. The Supervisor shall not enter the (bed) room of an athlete of opposite gender unless in a life threatening situation
- 8) Those driving vehicles will not drive impaired or fatigued

The recommendation is that the groups not travel by vehicle immediately after a competition or full day training. If this is not feasible, no one should drive for more than four hours immediately after the competition or training. Subsequent drivers should have at least had four hours rest before driving

Driver's to have full command of the vehicle and passengers and will enforce the use of seatbelts and follow NZ vehicle laws

- 9) Supervisors must be fully capable to care for athletes at all times
